

Every year, between September 15th and October 15th, National Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated here in the United States. We celebrate the histories, cultures, and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain,

Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

In this edition of Pawprints it is our honor to highlight the work of the following Hispanic nurses who contributed much to the vocation of nursing:

Maria Garcia Roach was a nurse anesthetist at

Charity Hospital in New Orleans. She later volunteered to serve at the start of World War II for the U.S. Army Air Forces (USAAF). She was initially assigned to work at a field hospital but later on was reassigned to attend a training program in Bowman Field in Kentucky when it was discovered that she was a licensed pilot. This training with the USAAF entailed medical and air evacuation service drills and care. She served as a nurse-pilot with the Army Corps between 1943-1945 and was responsible for the care and safety of wounded soldiers having logged over 1,000 hours of flying time and

traveled overseas to locations such as China, Burma, Africa, Germany and islands across the North and South Atlantic. Ms Roach was recognized for her wartime service and received many honors including the Bronze Star and Air Medal, "which recognizes single acts of heroism or major achievements during aerial flights".





Dr. Ildaura Murillo-Rohde is known for her many accomplishments including being the founder of the National Association of Hispanic Nurses. She received her nursing diploma from the Medical and Surgical Hospital School of Nursing in 1948. She went on to obtain her undergraduate degree in psychiatric mental health nursing from Columbia University in 1953.

Additionally, she went on to earn her Masters and Doctorate from New York University and became the first Hispanic nurse awarded a PhD in 1971. Her later work included being a reviewer of federal research and education grants in Washington, D.C. She held academic roles including the Dean and Professor Emeritus of Nursing at the State University of New York, School of Nursing in Brooklyn and Associate Dean of the School of Nursing at the University of Washington in Seattle. Her many honors include being named a permanent representative to UNICEF, being appointed by the New York Mayor to a commission on guality improvement at New York City hospitals and was a psychiatric nurse consultant to Guatemalan government by the World Health Organization.
